PRINCIPAL'S REPORT 2017 Results

- Results from 2017 were very impressive. Highest medium ATAR ever recorded at Carine of 83.45. 100% attainment rate. Sustained improvement across the school. 34 students received SCSA awards. A considerable amount of students gained places into the 90+ Club.
- Indications so far show that the Year 12s this year may achieve a higher ATAR. Counselling parents and students from Year 9 seems to be having a positive outcome. 4 students have been identified as possibly achieving below an ATAR of 70.
