Principal's Report:

- CSHS Medium ATAR for 2022 was 87.1
- Uniprep university pathway program first year being offered at CSHS
- Day 1 2023 went well:

Assembly was attended by 3000 people which included students, staff, year 12 students from 2022 who received awards and parents.

For 2023 attending CSHS there is 2430 students. There is 250 staff of those 42 are new to the school this year.

There was a morning tea for year 7 parents which was well attended

- CSHS celebrating 50 years this year. There will be celebrations which includes past principals to attend
- Building program running on time for handover in late term 3 and beginning to use the new building in term 4.

- For 2024 attending CSHS there will be approximately 2600 students, 420 460 students per year group. There will be 340 staff by this time which includes support staff.
- CSHS has a fulltime nurse as well as a Community Health Nurse
- CSHS has a maximum of 32 students per class
