Principal's Report:

- The P&C will now meet approximately once a term.
- Parking bay issue on Osmaston road. Concerns at Carine PS. 11 parking bays for P plate parking and the rest for the Carine PS. The council accidentally posted all the bays for P plate parking and left no bays for Carine PS parents. City of Stirling have now rectified this.
- Some students are parking illegally on the streets, curbs etc... This is discouraged.
- CSHS has received a Certificate of Commendation for maintaining a strong focus on Year 12 WACE as well as having a significant positive impact on progress and achievement, ensuring students are best placed for meaningful post – school opportunities.
- New building- handover in Term 4 2023. Use of building- teaching will begin Term 1 2024.

Discussion:

Queries raised by a P&C member, answered by Damian:

-How the P&C can support the reduction in school canteen lines?

This is not associated with the P&C.

The school canteen underwent an extension in Term 3 2020, using the uniform shop space, once it was relocated off premises. This has helped.

No mobile phones policy at the canteen has helped as well.

Understandably, though, with large student numbers it is difficult to totally overcome this.

- How the P&C can support the change in dialogue to promote ATAR Music at Carine SHS resulting in more numbers selecting Music as at ATAR subject?

This is not associated with the P&C.

Unfortunately, the music program does not have the numbers of students to sustain music as a ATAR subject.

-How the P&C can support a French tour for students selecting French as an elective from Year 9?

This is not associated with the P&C.

Any request for travel by school students needs to be presented to the Education Department of WA and the Minister for Education for approval.

Currently the CSHS French Department have requested a tour and the request is at central office awaiting a reply.

- Feedback of Year 9 camp accommodation standards at the Dare facility.

Kerri and Damian went to visit Dare and were disappointed. The next camp will be located at Swan Valley Adventure Camp. CSHS will change to holding a camp in year 7 instead of year 8/9.

Other discussion:

- Bunnings sausage sizzle in Balcatta to be held on Saturday 10th June to fundraise for the music tour in 2024
- Year 7 Disco/Social to be held Week 8 on Wednesday the 14th June in the gym. P&C will host a table promoting the P & C as well as having a sausage sizzle cooking sausages for the students attending. Mark Kepplinger, Sarneet Kohli, Carla Christou and Vicky Turner will volunteer. P & C flyers to be printed and distributed on the evening at the disco. Kerri along with the P&C will organise this.
- Appreciation P &C week next week.
- Vaping and its management. Government laws in Australia have recently changed. A
 ban of the importation of nonprescription vaping products. We hope this will see a
 change.
- Vaping sensors for bathrooms may be possible for the P&C to fund this. Other schools in WA are trialing this at the moment.

A parent attended this evening to represent a group of parents concerned about Almadine road and Osmaston Road roundabout. They are looking for parents to volunteer to count number of children, pedestrians and vehicles who cross morning and afternoon, on the 26th of May and the 9th of June, one morning and one afternoon. Needing 4 to 5 people each morning and afternoon, between the times of 7.30- 9.00 and 2.30 -4.00.

The gate at the staff parking, entry, on Osmaston Road is a dark area. A parent tripped and was injured, where the gates join. Kerri/ Damian will see that this is addressed.
