## **Carine Senior High School Colours and Honours Process**

Rewards and recognition are important at Carine Senior High School. One of the ways we acknowledge students for their positive contributions to our school is through the Colours and Honours awards which **are end of year award celebrations.** These are given to students who have achieved excellence through school-based endeavours in Academic, Service and Sport categories.

For all award types, recipients are approved by the principal. All applications are considered and the final decision falls to the principal.

## **Mid-Year Awards:**

Mid-Year Academic Certificates are celebrated in Years 7-10 through our Principal Awards. Students who meet the criteria from their Semester One report results are invited to a morning tea to celebrate their achievements.

Students who meet the criteria are eligible to receive a Carine 'Colour' for Academic, Service and Sporting achievements. These are presented at the end of the year for Students in Years 7-10. Year 11 Colours are presented at the first assembly the following year. Year 12 Honours are presented at the Final Year 12 Assembly. Students will receive a certificate and a badge.

For example:  Carols by Candlelight, fundraising for a local charity, Clean Up Day, work for non-profit organisations, Youth Advisory Councils, Peer Support, Parent/Teacher interview afternoons, parent tours etc.  Service colours are automatically awarded for participation in Anzac Day, Student Leadership Council and Prefect roles, Sandakan Service and Academic Mentoring. | Years 7-11  Colours will be awarded to students who are members of school teams/groups which meet the following conditions:  1) The competition must be a recognised interschool or champion school event.  2) The team/group commitment must involve a serious training/rehearsal aspect before the event.  3) The team/group manager/coach may consider the individual training/rehearsal commitments of students.  4) The student must play/perform in at least 80% of the season games/performances.  5) The student must demonstrate a high level of sportsmanship and commitment to the welfare of the team/group.  6) Nominations may be completed for students who have given a time commitment in the areas of coaching or team management.  NOTE: In exceptional circumstances, a manager/coach may consider students who do not meet all of the above criteria.  Students who participate in National and State events can nominate for recognition but are not acknowledged through Sporting colours.
