Principal's Report:

CSHS currently has 2587 students

CSHS is fully staffed

IT department has been understaffed. Have recently employed 2 staff. Will be employing another 2. Have received over 30 applicants.

All students have access to the bathroom during class time. Due to some bathrooms being vandilised at these times there are 2 toilet blocks open and are monitored by 1 staff member and 1 cleaner

Parent teacher meetings - Thursday 1st May and Monday 5th May- went well. Very organised

CSHS is the 4th largest public school in WA
